The world's smallest metropolis Cosmopolitan Geneva - a world of its own, a world for everyone, quite apart from the rest of Switzerland. Capital of Peace is one of its names - the European headquarters of the United Nations is located here. Another well-deserved name for this city with a humanitarian tradition, international organisations and cosmopolitan flair, is The World's Smallest Metropolis. Quays, lakeside promenades, parks, elegant stores and lively streets and alleyways in the old part of town wait to be discovered. Boat trips beckon on the lake and the Rhone River. The Alps seem close enough to touch. Geneva - small metropolis surrounded by unspoiled nature and breath taking scenery. On its limits lie magnificent country estates, hidden behind ancient stands of oak, and, to the north, peaceful villages, home of fruity Perlan wines.

Built in three tiers, Lausanne has the sparkling blue waters of Lake Geneva at its feet, deep green forests at its back and snow-capped Alps in the distance. It is a city to explore with your senses, offering everything from quaint country markets to cosmopolitan shops and shows. A climb up to the Old City will take you to Lausanne's superb gothic cathedral, to the ancient castle of Saint Maire and to the university with its fine museums. Down by the waterside is the picturesque resort of Ouchy (more time to explore Ouchy), where you can linger in one of the lakeside restaurants and visit the Olympic Museum, and temporary museum on a boat.

Chocolate Factory Cailler in Broc

The visitor trail provides a complete immersion into the brand, its history and products. The experience is sensitive, sensual and poetic, giving the visitor a window into the world of chocolate by means of a transparent and sparkling aesthetic. This sense of imagination is paired with presentations on the different stages in the Caillers chocolate production process, which are relayed as part of the interactive audiovisual guided tour. Through cameras the visitors can watch live as the ingredients of chocolate are processed. The past is also present through an updated selection of photographs that retrace the factory's history, from its humble origins in 1898 right up to the 1960s. This journey through time brings back many memories. Appetites whetted, visitors can then visit a "tasting room" where you can try as many and as much of the chocolate as you desire!

The Lavaux Vineyard Terraces of Switzerland have been chosen by UNESCO as a new World Heritage Site. The Terraces stretch for about 30 kilometers along the south-facing northern shores of Lake Geneva, in the Vaud region. They cover the lower slopes of the mountainside between the villages and the lake, and their origins can be traced back to the 11th century

Montreux is the most frequented resort on Lac Leman (Lake of Geneva), thanks to its beautiful location and pleasant surrounding countryside. The city stretches gently along the shore of a wide, south-facing bay and rises above the lake like a huge amphitheatre amidst the wooded and vine-clad slopes. Montreux has attracted many visitors since the 18th century. Its palm trees give sample proof of its mild climate. The main features of the city tour is the Vieux Montreux (the old parts of the township) and, of course, the visit of the Castle of Chillon - one of the most impressive, medieval strongholds of Switzerland, immortalised by many famous poets

Drive by motor coach through Aigle, along the Rhone Valley - the orchard of Switzerland - through pretty towns, such as Martigny, Sion and Sierre. At Taesch the road ends, as Zermatt is traffic-banned, and your journey continues by train to Zermatt, at the foot of the Matterhorn - the rocky pyramid, the outline of which is renowned throughout the world...Zermatt is a beautiful Alpine resort where the air is sparkling with an almost forgotten purity. There's great shopping and nightlife in Zermatt too!
