
Computer Adaptive Testing

WHAT IS COMPUTER ADAPTIVE TESTING (CAT)?

A group of questions used to gather information about your health.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

- Start by answering the first question.
- The CAT picks the next question from a large group of questions based on your response.
- Continue answering questions while the CAT estimates your abilities, usually represented as a number. This should only take between 4–6 questions.
- Your provider can help you understand what your score means and together you can set goals and make decisions about your care.
