

A Third Year DPT Student Tells All Presentation

Prior to presenting my PowerPoint, "A Third Year DPT Student Tells All," I administered a prequiz to the students. Following my presentation I administered a posttest to gauge what students had learned by attending my presentation. These two assessments also helped me evaluate what I can improve on during future presentations.

When examining the pretest scores for the students who completed the assessment (N=40), it was determined that the average score on the pretest was a 40.1%. When examining the posttest scores for the students who completed the assessment (N=40), it was determined that the average score was 87.9%. This is an increase of +47.8%. At the bottom of the page I have provided various graphs, which detail levels of improvement for each question. Further, 100% of students stated that the presentation "A 3rd Year DPT Student Tells All" was very useful and that it covered everything they hoped it would. 90% of students gave the presenter (me) a grade of "A", while 10% of students gave the presenter a grade of "B". The average GPA for all students attending the presentation was 3.54, with scores ranging from 2.8-4.0. Demographic information is listed below:

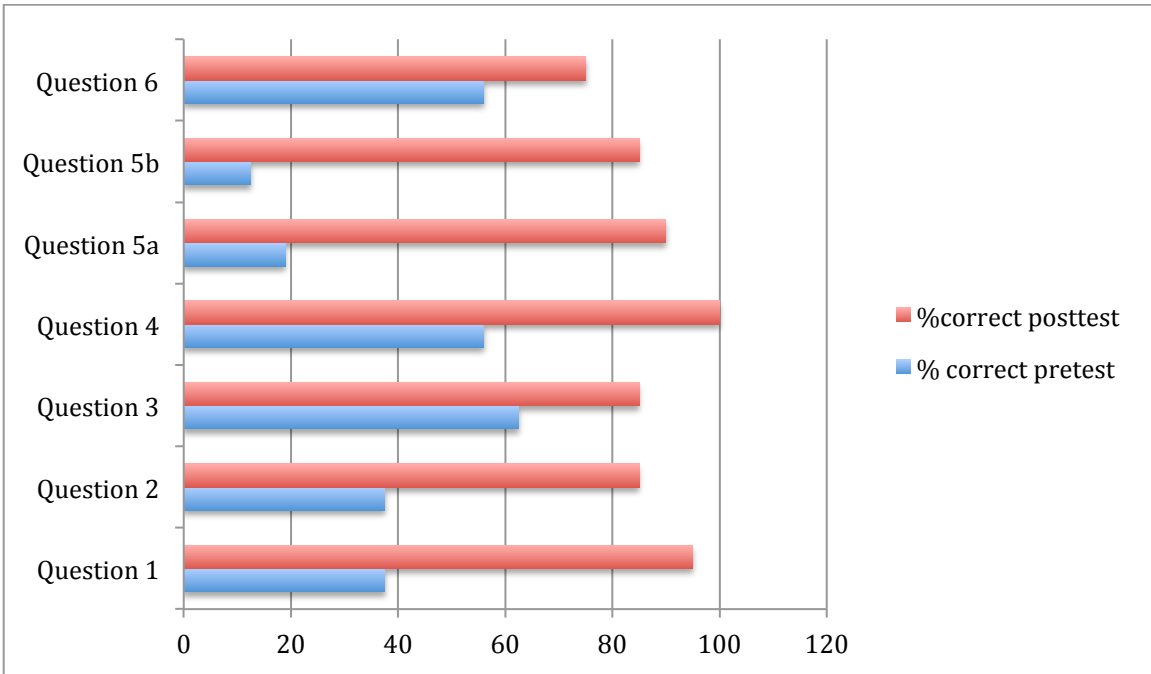

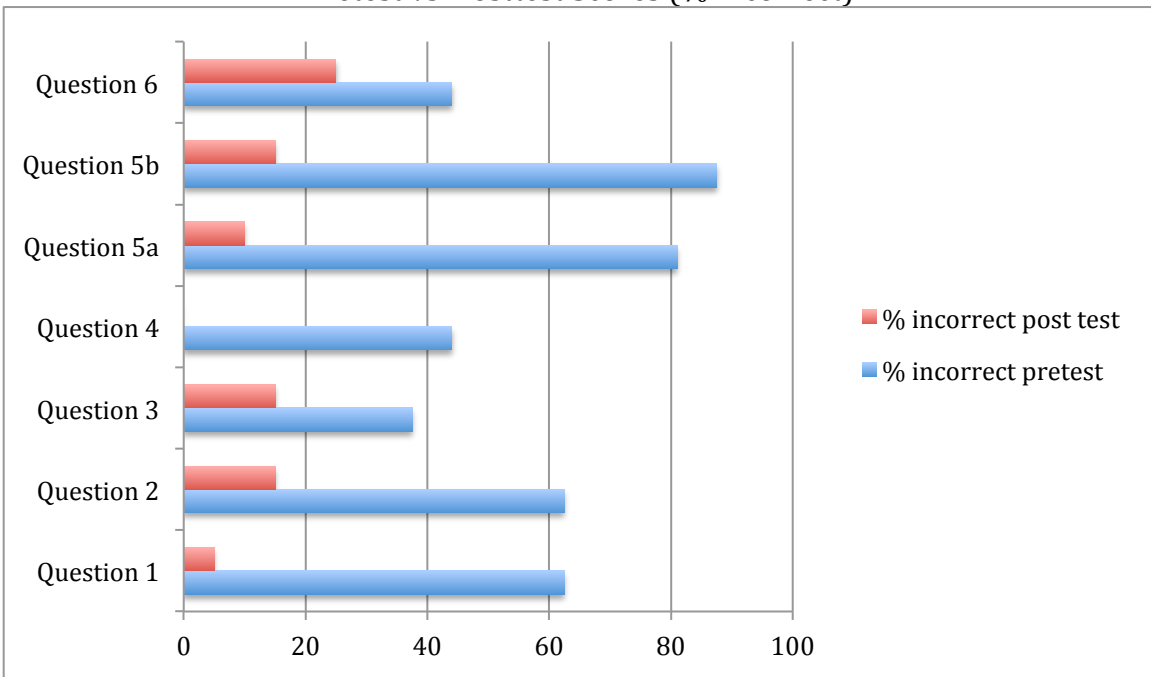
