- Too much text on the slides
- Slow down a bit. I know you were talking into a computer but it was hard to take notes as fast as you were talking
- Anatomy section was not as clear, pictures were confusing
- Case presentation on the front end could have been an engaging introduction and given more information as to context of what general TOS looks like
- May have just been a problem I had but sound became choppy and hard to hear after 34 minutes
- Giving more examples of occupations/ activities that might cause or lead to TOS on slides
- Put anatomy and picture on the same slide so image can be seen while you are explaining it
- Some over-simplification/ explanation, probably would have been great in live action though
- Might have been a little too much repetition
- Sometimes a lot of audio on one slide , might want to break it up
