OBJECTIVES

- 1. Help current DPT students better understand the overall flow of an equipment evaluation
- 2. Provide information on device delivery and appropriate follow-up with patients, insurance agencies, and vendors
- 3. Gather patient and vendor perspective on how physical therapists can improve the process of obtaining equipment
- 4. Increase collaboration between future physical therapists and equipment vendors by clarifying roles during and after an equipment evaluation
- 5. Demonstrate appropriate subjective and objective measures to appropriately determine equipment needs
- 6. Include a letter of medical necessity for a specific equipment evaluation case.

- 15 yo F born with polymicrogyria at 33 weeks
 - Seizures
 - Failure to thrive and G tube
 - Inability to manage secretions
- Delayed developmental milestones
- Complex dysautonomia
 - Improved medical management
- Spinal fusion for scoliosis
 - Followed by 42-day ICU stay
